Guiding horticultural investors and growers in the Peel-Harvey

Horticulture Guide for investors and Growers

Through its work on the Peel Sustainable Agriculture Technical Working Group, PHCC has assisted in the development of a suite of information tools for those planning to establish or expand horticultural operations in the Peel-Harvey Coastal Catchment. The Peel-Harvey Coastal Catchment grows more than \$350 million of agricultural produce across 142,790 hectares, with production expected to increase significantly over the next two decades.

The tools are designed to give investors, growers and local government the information and guidance necessary to make decisions which lead to more sustainable horticultural developments and protect water quality and the health of Catchment waterways.

The suite of tools include a:

- Brochure guiding investors and growers on site selection for investment, emphasising the importance of a site's land capability

- Model local planning policy to assist proponents and local governments considering horticultural proposals
- Detailed regional-scale mapping of land capability across the Coastal Catchment

The inter-linked tools assist horticultural proponents from the point of site selection through to development application and give them the confidence to address local and state government policy requirements in the one process.

The PHCC worked closely with the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD), Shire of Murray and other TWG members to prepare the brochure and model local planning policy. The land capability mapping, prepared by DPIRD, is made publicly available on the PHCC website along with all information tools.

Through continued promotion and improvement, it is hoped that this initiative will assist in making new horticulture in the Catchment, including the Peel Food Zone, catchment-friendly, sustainable and profitable.
