

Contracts Included in the Targets

Contracts with a registered Aboriginal business (that are published on Tenders WA) where the value is \$50,000 or more.

Collaborative arrangements that are a minimum of 50% owned by a registered Aboriginal business.

Panel arrangements that include a registered Aboriginal business.

Contracts Excluded from the Targets

Contracts valued below \$50,000.

Subcontracting arrangements.

Variations to awarded contracts.

Contracts awarded by a third party on behalf of government.

Achievement of Targets

Issued to the Minister for Finance.

Published on the Department of Finance website.

Publicly available to agencies and Aboriginal businesses.

Aboriginal Business Initiatives

Aboriginal Business Exemption (Goods & Services)

Agency-Specific Initiatives (Goods & Services, Works)

Aboriginal Business Exemption – G&S

Directly Purchasing from an Aboriginal Business

- Agencies can choose to issue a Request directly to a registered Aboriginal business.
- Agencies can use this option instead of purchasing from a mandatory whole of government contract.
- Aboriginal businesses must be registered on ABDWA or Supply Nation for this option to apply.
