Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.

River Action Plans for the Hotham and Williams Rivers

As part of the Newmont Boddington Gold and PHCC partnership, River Actions Plans (RAPs) and River Health Assessments (RHAs) are being planned for the Hotham and Williams Rivers.

It is proposed that the RAPs will involve assessments of the river foreshore in approx. 6 locations across the catchment which have significant community values and will inform proposed restoration works. The RHAs will provide a snap shot of the health of the river and a baseline prior to restoration works. It is planned the RHAs are conducted again after restoration works to measure change in river health over time.

PHCC will be getting in touch with the Shires, landholders and wider community to discuss these plans in the coming months.
