NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Constitution, *Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015* and *the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*. The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at reporting date.

Revenue from grant funding, provided under contractual arrangements is taken up on a proportionate basis net of GST, over the period to which the funding relates. Funds received in advance at balance date are recognised as a liability within the balance sheet and carried forward to the next accounting period. Refer Note 2 for further details.

The following income accounts include internal charges raised against specific projects undertaken throughout the year, with corresponding expense charges levied to individual projects to recoup organisational management costs and other costs incurred by Peel - Harvey Catchment Council, in accordance with individual project budgets:

(b) Non Current Assets

Freehold land and buildings are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation.

The Committee has determined assets costing \$6,500 or greater are capitalised in the balance sheet. All other assets costing less than \$6,500 are expensed when incurred.

The depreciable amount of plant and equipment, IT equipment, computer assets and furniture and fittings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements on buildings not owned by the association are expensed at the time of being incurred.

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements have been measured at their nominal amount (excluding any on-costs).

Long service leave is accrued from the date an employee reaches their first year anniversary of service and is classified as current after seven years of continuous service.

(d) Committed Grant

Peel-Harvey Catchment Council Inc. utilises funding to pay land holders, and other suppliers/third parties for successful grant applications. Where grant money has been committed at balance date however not paid to these grant applicants, the committed grant money is recognised as a current liability.

(e) Grant Acquitted

For the purpose of acquitting grants provided by funding bodies, the association has adopted the following policies:

Grant income is acquitted after allowing for the following costs:

- Cost including labour and on costs directly associated with a specific grant;
- Administration and other related overhead costs (after excluding costs which are abnormal both in nature and value and therefore not representative of an appropriate level of costs that would be expected to be incurred) not related to a specific grant are allocated over the relevant grants, based on a proportion of the level of each grant and related income compared to total income.

Representations of management and internal documentation are used in determining to which grants a cost may be directly or indirectly attributed.

(e) Income Tax Exemption

Peel-Harvey Catchment Council is exempt from income tax under S50-145 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 June 2019, the profit and loss statement, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the declaration by those charged with governance.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report has been prepared in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015* and Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012*, including:

- i) giving a true and fair view, in all material aspects, of the financial position of Peel Harvey
 Catchment Council Inc. as at 30 June 2019, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended; and

Other Information

Those charged with governance are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. annual report for the year ended 30 June 2019, but does not include the financial report and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

30 JUNE 2019 MANAGEMENT REPORT

Following completion of our 30 June 2019 audit, we provide our Management Report and audit recommendations.

1.0 Our Audit Approach

The Australian Auditing Standards are the professional Standards applicable to all audit engagements. Accordingly, our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, with testing designed solely to enable the expression of an opinion on the financial report of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. This involved us making an assessment of the risk of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and then using our professional judgement, applying audit procedures to mitigate that risk.

To assist those responsible for governance in understanding our role as external auditor, we have previously detailed our audit responsibilities and scope of work to be performed to meet those responsibilities in our audit engagement letter.

Australian Auditing Standards require us to document and evaluate Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc.'s system of internal control to establish the level of reliance on the internal control system in determining the nature, timing and extent of other auditing procedures necessary to enable us to complete our audit. This work is not primarily directed towards the discovery of weaknesses or the detection of fraud or other irregularities and should not, therefore, be taken to assume that no other weaknesses exist. Accordingly the comments within this letter refer only to those matters that have come to our attention during the course of our normal audit work and may not identify all possible improvements that an internal controls review may detect.

Our audit approach is based on a risk analysis methodology which relies upon our understanding of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc.'s operations, strategies and risks. We performed a review of applicable accounting systems and tested those during our audit. The level of testing performed by us is determined by the degree of reliance we place on the internal control systems in place which has a resulting impact on the amount of substantive testing required during our audit procedures. The level of testing performed is also aligned with what is required to form an overall opinion on the financial statements which may not coincide with what Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. perceives should be tested.

Our audit also included evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and judgements, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report. There were no areas of disagreement either in the accounting estimates or judgements or in the presentation and disclosures made in the financial report.

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2.0 Segregation of Duties

Inevitably in the environment of an organisation with a limited number of employees available to undertake accounting and administration roles, it is impracticable to have good division of duties and internal checks in place in relation to invoicing and receipting, processing and preparation of payments and, recording of transactions. As a result, there is inherently an increased risk that errors or omissions may go undetected.

3.0 Assessment of Fraud and Error

The primary responsibility for the prevention and detection of fraud is that of the Committee and management. As a result, it is important that management with the oversight of the Committee place a strong emphasis on fraud prevention, which may reduce opportunities for fraud to take place and fraud deterrence, which could persuade individuals not to commit fraud because of the likelihood of detection and resulting consequences.

In accordance with Australian Auditing Standards we are required to obtain reasonable assurance that the financial report taken as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. While our procedures are designed to identify material weaknesses and misstatements from fraud and error, there is an unavoidable risk that even some material misstatements may remain undiscovered. This unavoidable risk is due to the test nature and other inherent limitations of an audit, together with the inherent limitations of any accounting and internal control system.

We have confirmed that nothing has come to management's attention that may constitute an incident of fraud. In addition our audit procedures did not identify any instances of suspected or actual fraud. We take this opportunity to remind you that our audit is not designed to detect fraud and therefore our audit procedures are not designed for that purpose.

4.0 Significant Difficulties Encountered during the Audit

During the course of our audit, there were no areas where we experienced significant difficulties.

5.0 Audit Adjustments and Unadjusted Audit Differences

During the course of our audit, we did not identify misstatements considered to be material at a financial report level and therefore no adjustment was required to be reflected within the final audited financial report.

6.0 Going Concern

We have undertaken a review of the ability of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. to continue as a going concern for twelve months from the date of signing our audit report and therefore whether the going concern basis for the preparation of the financial report is appropriate.

The assumption of going concern was concluded as appropriate following a review of operating budgets and information provided by management. As disclosed within notes to the financial statements, Peel Harvey Catchment Council Inc. is dependent upon continued financial support by way of grants and contributions. We have drawn attention to this within our audit report.

7.0 Accounting Policies

We confirm to you that we are not aware of any changes to the accounting policies of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc. since 30 June 2018 in respect of the preparation of the 30 June 2019 financial report.

8.0 Commitments and Contingencies

On completion of our audit and subsequent discussions with management, we did not identify any additional commitments or contingencies that required disclosure within the financial report of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc., apart from those already disclosed.

9.0 Subsequent Events

We did not identify any additional subsequent events up until the date of this report that required disclosure within the financial report of Peel – Harvey Catchment Council, apart from those already disclosed.

10.0 Audit Report Qualifications

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for Peel - Harvey Catchment Council Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over reimbursements, service receipts, donations, fund raising activities and cash receipts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to income was limited to amounts recorded in the financial records.

As in prior years, this is a standard qualification due to the nature of various cash income received by Peel – Harvey Catchment Council Inc.

11.0 Other Matters

In accordance with the terms of our engagement letter, we have a responsibility to provide an opinion in respect to Peel-Harvey Catchment Council Inc.'s annual financial report as to whether it is free from material misstatement. With exception to the cash receipts qualification noted within our audit report which is common for organisations of Peel-Harvey Catchment Council Inc.'s size and nature, our audit report for 30 June 2019 is unqualified with our opinion stating the financial report presents fairly the financial position of the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council Inc., as at and for the year ending 30 June 2019.

We are pleased to report our audit procedures indicated financial records have been maintained to high standards throughout the audit period.

We would like to thank Jane and Karen for providing accounting files and related documentation at the commencement of our audit electronically on a USB. Due to the high quality of the financial records and reconciliations provided to us which correctly supported year end balances we are pleased to report there are no audit adjustments and no audit recommendations arising from our audit.

There are few audits undertaken by us which result in minimal or no recommendations which is a credit to the commitment and preparedness of Jane, Karen and the team in achieving such an audit result.
