The Peel-Harvey Catchment is home to the Peel-Yalgorup wetlands encompassing our estuary and surrounding lakes which are recognised as internationally important under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands. These waterways provide habitat for many amazing species from our estuary's resident Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphins to thousands of migratory shorebirds.

Litter and debris across our catchment makes its way into our waterways, causing injury and even death to wildlife through ingestion and entanglement of materials like plastics. In its fifth year in 2021, Clean Up the Peel Month each March brings together the efforts of many community groups and individuals to help clean up our waterways for the benefit of the many species that rely on them.
