Program Context

CONTEXT

The Healthy Waterways program is delivered through the following projects, aimed at restoring or protecting the ecological health and biodiversity of Peel-Harvey waterways (wetlands, rivers and streams) particularly those on the Swan Coastal Plain:

- Wetlands and People a community restoring the ecological character of the Peel-Yalgorup Ramsar 482 Wetlands (2019-2023)
- 'Healthy Estuaries WA' (2021-24)
- 'Healing Bilya restoring the Murray and Serpentine Rivers' (2021-2023)

These projects involve working in partnership with a range of stakeholders including community, government, research institutes and non-government organisations to undertake:

- on-ground restoration works including fencing, revegetation, weed control, and feral animal control;
- community and Noongar engagement, education and capacity building initiatives, including citizen science;
- measurement and evaluation of ecological health e.g. surveys of vegetation; water quality; fish and aquatic invertebrates.
- preparation of River Action Plans to assess the current state of the Murray River (WA) and guide future restoration activities

Key Responsibilities

The successful applicant will demonstrate a high level of initiative in accordance with the requirements of the position to:

- 1. Practise and advocate Principles and Values of the PHCC, including those that guide interpersonal behaviour, professional practice and natural resource management practitioners.
- 2. Manage project budgets in accordance with PHCC's policies and procedures.
- 3. Manage all projects and resources to deliver the program, meeting contractual obligations including all milestone and reporting requirements within timeframes and budget.
- 4. Manage, support and supervise the Program team, contractors, and volunteers / interns.
- 5. Participate in strategic planning and advocacy to guide the Healthy Waterways Program towards the PHCC vision and objectives.
- 6. Liaise with other NRM Regions to explore cross-regional delivery opportunities.
- 7. Ensure collaborative delivery of the program across the PHCC team (i.e. working across other programs with relevant officers) and external stakeholders.
- 8. Ensure a high level of Work Health and Safety standards for self, colleagues, contractors and stakeholders.
- 9. Contribute to the effective operation of the PHCC applying a team work approach.
- 10. Develop and design projects towards PHCC's Strategic Directions and delivery of the program.
- 11. Provide strategic advice to the CEO and Board.
- 12. Maintain an awareness of information and policy that will impact on the program, identify opportunities and threats and respond appropriately through development or adaption of the program.
- 13. Contribute to the development and upkeep of knowledge management systems.
- 14. Contribute to communications and engagement practices that support capacity building, NRM outcomes and program promotion.
